What is CCA?

Community Choice Aggregation (CCA), is a state enabled program, which offers residents and small businesses the opportunity to receive more attractive electricity supply terms through the bargaining power of aggregation (group purchasing).

What is the Municipality's Role?

The village enabled CCA through a local law and selected a program administrator.

Who is the CCA Administrator?

Joule Community Power, a division of Joule Assets, who has been authorized by the state to administer CCA programs in New York.

<u>Can I participate if I already have rooftop</u> <u>solar or community solar or hydro?</u>

Yes, you can participate!

<u>Does this program replace my utility</u> <u>company?</u>

No, O&R will still be responsible for billing and responding to power outages.

How will my bill look?

You will still receive one bill from O&R, but the supply section of your electricity bill will show the name of the alternative supplier/CCA Administrator. This program does not impact the delivery portion of your electricity bill, the reliability of your electricity delivery, or how you are billed. If you have a power outage, please contract O&R.

What is Opt-Out Enrollment?

Opt-out enrollment means that you will be automatically enrolled to participate in the CCA program unless you are already receiving supply service from an alternative supplier, have a block on your account, or take action to opt-out of the program. There is no fee or penalty for opting out. You may opt out during the opt-out period or at any time during the program. Contact the helpline, if you have questions about eligibility.

How do I opt out?

Only eligible residents and small businesses will receive a letter in March 2025, explaining their options, the program rates and how they can opt out in the 30 day opt out period which will run from March 10 to April 8. If you decide to not participate in the program, please respond in one of these three way. A. Mail: return the included "opt out" card via pre-paid envelope, B. Please note that if you do not opt-out before April 9th, you will be enrolled in ESCO service under the contract terms.
